OPERATION SAFE DRIVER WEEK: SUPPORTING THE SAFETY OF THOSE WHO DRIVE NORTH AMERICA'S COMMERCIAL VEHICLES

Bendix Highlights the Importance of Equipping Truck Drivers with Technology and Training

AVON, Ohio – July 11, 2022 – There's a reason it's not called "Operation Safe Driverless Truck Week."

"There is simply no bigger factor in commercial vehicle and highway safety than the person driving," said Fred Andersky, Bendix director of Government and Industry Affairs. "And while driver assistance technologies are advancing rapidly, nothing on the road today is remotely close to fully replacing a skilled and alert driver, which is why we work so hard to provide equipment and training that enables them to perform at their best. It's also why we thank them every chance we get, and why we support the goals of the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance's (CVSA) Operation Safe Driver Week."

Operation Safe Driver Week – July 10-16 this year – is a safe-driving awareness and outreach initiative aimed at improving the driving behaviors of passenger vehicle drivers and commercial motor vehicle drivers. CVSA works with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) during the week to promote traffic law and safety belt enforcement, operating safely around commercial vehicles, roadside inspections, regulatory compliance, and commercial driver education.

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Equipping Drivers in Support of Safety

The FMCSA's most recent Large Truck and Bus Crash Facts report found that the number of crashes involving large trucks – particularly Class 7 and 8 vehicles – continued to climb in 2019, the most recent year for available statistics. That year, there were more than a half-million crashes involving large trucks, and more than 134,000 of them involved trucks with a gross vehicle weight rating (GVWR) over 26,000 pounds.

"A fully loaded combination vehicle can weigh 20-30 times more than a car, resulting in greater impact force when a collision occurs," Andersky observed. "Avoiding these types of crashes in the first place is what will help deliver reductions in fatalities, injuries, and property damage. Along with safe driving practices, technologies like forward collision mitigation are proven to help safe drivers mitigate truck front-leading crashes, and blind spot technologies can help mitigate sideswipe incidents.

"Even with systems like electronic stability control being mandated and truck manufacturers making collision mitigation standard, it can take years or even decades before most of the vehicles on the road are equipped with safety technologies. And that's why we still need to focus our industry's safety efforts on supporting drivers and their skills – along with their understanding of what technologies can and can't do to help them on the road."

As it becomes increasingly important to prepare and educate drivers on how leading-edge safety systems work and their capabilities on the road, Bendix has expanded its driver-focused efforts. These include on-site demonstrations and ride-and-drive training sessions, videos exploring its systems and explaining the in-cab experience at Bendix's YouTube channel (youtube.com/user/bendixvideos), and the company's "Truck Talk with Bendix" podcast's "Driver Insight Series" collection of episodes. All these resources are designed to help ensure safety systems are used correctly and to their maximum benefit.

Bendix safety technologies complement safe driving practices. No commercial vehicle safety technology replaces a skilled, alert driver exercising safe driving techniques and proactive, comprehensive driver training. Responsibility for the safe operation of the vehicle remains with the driver at all times.

Driver Assistance – Not Replacement

"Over the past decade, fleets have reported that equipping their tractors with Bendix® Wingman® collision mitigation technologies – as well as training their drivers on the technology – has resulted in significant reductions in rear-end collisions, as well as decreased severity of those that did occur," said TJ Thomas, Bendix director of marketing and customer solutions,

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Controls. "Even the best drivers on the road sometimes need help: That's where these assistance systems come in, helping drivers to recognize a potential collision and take appropriate actions to potentially avoid it."

Bendix[®] Wingman[®] Fusion[™] – the company's flagship system – integrates information from forward-facing radar, video, and the vehicle's braking system, combining and crosschecking the data from sensors that work together and not just in parallel. By creating a detailed and more accurate picture from this information, Fusion delivers enhanced autonomous emergency braking and adaptive cruise control, along with following distance alerts, lane departure warning, and alerts when speeding – all while prioritizing alerts to help reduce driver distraction. Severe event-based data – including video – can be wirelessly transmitted and is accessible via SafetyDirect[®] by Bendix CVS for driver coaching and analysis by fleet safety personnel.

Thomas noted that the Bendix Wingman Fusion system now has even more capabilities, including multi-lane autonomous emergency braking, highway departure warning and braking, and advanced adaptive cruise control features to improve driver convenience.

Fusion is built on the foundational technology of the Bendix[®] ESP[®] Electronic Stability Program full-stability system. This enables it to help drivers avoid some additional situations, including rollovers, loss-of-control, and sideswipe crashes. Fusion comes standard on several major North American on-highway makes and models.

Additionally, Fusion's forward-facing camera enables the system to read roadside speed limit signs and provide Overspeed Alert and Action. Speeding is a key area of enforcement focus during Operation Safe Driver Week.

Safety Rides on the Wheel-Ends

"Driver-centric fleets have been telling us for years how much their teams behind the wheel appreciate the feel and performance of air disc brakes," said Mark Holley, Bendix director of marketing and customer solutions, Wheel-End. "But drivers also depend every day on the right drum brakes, slack adjusters that prevent brake drag, spring brakes that deliver reliability, and friction engineered for stopping power and durability. The equipment you put at your wheelends is crucial in ensuring that your trucks and higher-level safety systems perform the way your drivers expect and require."
